Palm Sunday Reflection from Fr. Pius Duke: Today, Palm Sunday, we enter the Holy Week. We remember how Jesus entered Jerusalem riding on a donkey. The Readings remind us of the passion and death of our Saviour. Today and throughout this Holy Week we shall do well to reflect on the trial, the condemnation, the suffering, and the death of our Lord. The prophet Isaiah speaks of the manner the Saviour was insulted and humiliated and yet how he was untouched by these humiliations. He bore them courageously with patience. God the Father will glorify him for humbling himself and willingly bearing all the humiliations. The Gospel speaks in detail about the passion of the Lord. The reading of these details should help us to understand better the gravity of our sins which caused these sufferings, the immensity of the love the Lord has for us which made him willingly undergo these sufferings, and how we should be careful not to add to his sufferings through our sins. It is an undeniable fact that this Holy Week will be different because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Undoubtedly many are suffering from the scourge. But the Lord will be with us even when we are like the disciples, fearful for our own safety rather than faithfulness to Jesus. He can and will turn even this crisis to redound to his glory.
