**An Act of Spiritual Communion:**

**The assisted suicide lobby are currently running a large campaign to put pressure on the Government to reconsider the legalisation of assisted suicide.** Thankfully, the Government has so far resisted these attempts and emphasised their commitment to neutrality on this issue. The Church holds that it is important that the Government continues to hold strong against pressure from assisted suicide campaigners and rejects their demands. Right To Life UK has set up an easy-to-use tool to enable you to email your MP asking the Government not to give in to the demands. It only takes about half a minute to email your MP. **Sacramental Preparation.** Once again, the coronavirus COVID-19 has forced us to change our plans for your child's First Holy Communion. As you know, I had hoped that it would be possible for your child to make his/her First Confession over the next two weeks and then receive Holy Communion for the first time, either on 17<sup>th</sup> or 24<sup>th</sup> January. I am very sorry to say that this will no longer be possible. Going on the latest announcements from the Prime Minister I think we must now look to dates after Easter, late April or early May, for the children to make their First Holy Communion. Hopefully, the situation will have improved by then and, who knows, perhaps by then we shall even be able to have a party for the children afterwards and do the celebrations properly.

Is this not the simplest prayer which parents can offer for their children? To bless them, that is, to entrust them to the Lord.”*
