**Tier 4.** As you know, because of the rapid spread of the Coronavirus we have now been moved into Tier 4 where we are encouraged not to leave home if it can be avoided. So far, Places of Worship are still allowed to open for public services – and we shall continue to do so here at Sacred Heart until we are told otherwise.

### **An Act of Spiritual Communion:**

*“My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.”*

### **Prayer at the end of Mass:**

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.*

I shall be away from Wednesday afternoon until Friday evening this week. That means there will be no Holy Hour and Mass here on Thursday evening this week. Normal service will resume next week.

**The Solemnity of the Epiphany.** After many years when this feast was celebrated on the nearest Sunday, it has now been reinstated on its proper date, 6<sup>th</sup> January. In a normal year it would be a Holyday of Obligation when we are obliged to attend Mass. This year, because of the pandemic, the obligation is removed and if, because of your health, you are in any doubt whether to come, then please do not. If you are able to access our livestreaming you can take part in the Mass in that way. Mass here that day will be at 9.00 am.

**Sacramental Preparation.** It has been a very difficult and frustrating period of preparation for the children who were hoping to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion for the first time last Summer. I am grateful to the teachers at Our Lady's School and St John Fisher School for making it possible for them to complete the preparation in their "bubbles" at school. That has been a great blessing. It is impossible to make firm plans under the COVID-19 dominated circumstances, but I am hoping that they will be able to make their First Holy Communion, either here or at Our Lady Help of Christians in Cowley, on one of two Sundays: 17<sup>th</sup> January and 24<sup>th</sup> January. The reason for a choice of Sundays is to try to limit the numbers of people attending without restricting the number of family members. I regret, but we cannot have a party after Mass.



**Commemorative Candles.** For £5 you can buy a candle that will be blessed at Christmas and then will burn in the sanctuary or by the statues of the Sacred Heart or Our Lady for any week of your choice during the coming year. It can be for any reason you want: to remember a loved one; for a special intention; or why not give one as a Christmas present?

**The assisted suicide lobby are currently running a large campaign to put pressure on the Government to reconsider the legalisation of assisted suicide.** Thankfully, the Government has so far resisted these attempts and emphasised their commitment to neutrality on this issue. The Church holds that it is important that the Government continues to hold strong against pressure from assisted suicide campaigners and rejects their demands. Right To Life UK has set up an easy-to-use tool to enable you to email your MP asking the Government not to give in to the demands. It only takes about half a minute to email your MP. **The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.** The traditional time for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is 18<sup>th</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> January, the days between the feasts of St Peter and St Paul. This year it has been prepared by the Monastic Community of Grandchamp in Switzerland. They chose a theme based on *John 15:1-17: Abide in my love and you shall bear much fruit.*
