#### **Prayer at the end of Mass:**

#### Honouring Sunday.

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have not yet reimposed the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays, but if you have not been attending Mass since the pandemic began they ask you strongly to reflect on your Sunday practices and, if you can, to return to Mass on Sundays. The full statement is available at the back of the church.

**Feast of the Immaculate Conception.** The phrase "Immaculate Conception" does not refer to the conception of Jesus, as some people think, but rather to the conception of Mary. It means that through the merits of her Son, she was totally free from sin from the first moment of her life, her conception. Because the Immaculate Conception is the Patroness of the Archdiocese, this Feast, which falls on Wednesday, is a big day for us. There will be Mass here in Our Lady's church at 12.00 noon that day. There will also be Mass at Sacred Heart at 6.00 in the evening.

**The Sower.** The latest edition of the Diocesan magazine, The Sower, is available (free) as you leave church today.

**Poor Parishes Fund.** There will be a second collection at Masses this weekend for the Poor Parishes of the Diocese. The Fund is to help those smaller parishes where they have difficulty in paying their day-to-day bills.
