COVID precautions. The latest guidelines from the Bishops' Conference make these points:

- Anyone with symptoms of Covid should stay at home.
- Hand sanitiser should be available for all to use at places of entry and exit to our churches.
- The necessity for social distancing is removed. (Note that in Sacred Heart we shall continue to make the left side of the church available for parishioners who prefer to keep some distance).
- Those who wish to wear a face covering may do so during the celebration of Mass. (Note that in Sacred Heart I ask that you continue to wear a face covering).
- Altar servers are encouraged to return.
- Singing can occur and there is a general encouragement to wear face coverings while singing.
- There is no further need for track and trace.

The Sacrament of Confirmation. Bishop William will be coming to Sacred Heart on Sunday, 29th May to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation during the 6.00 pm Mass. Lectio Divina. On Monday mornings after the 9.15 Mass, we shall read a small section of St. Luke's Gospel together and pray about it. It will last about half an hour; anyone is welcome to take part. There is a sheet about *Lectio Divina* in the porch if you want to know more.

Easter Duties. All Catholics who have made their First Holy Communion should receive the Holy Eucharist sometime between Ash Wednesday and Pentecost Sunday. They should also take part in the Sacrament of Penance before receiving this Easter Communion.

Tailpiece. A certain Reverend Houston was once asked to lead a service at Crathie in the presence of Queen Victoria. During the service he decided to include an impromptu prayer for the monarch which entreated the Lord in words that went something like this: "Grant that as she grows to be an old woman, she may be made a new man, and stand before Thee as a pure virgin, bringing forth sons and daughters to Thy glory; and that in all peaceful causes she may go forth before her people like a he-goat on the mountains." The Rev Houston was not invited to officiate at Crathie again.
