Welcome to Sacred Heart for Mass today, especially if you are new to the parish or visiting for Easter. The Easter Season began on Easter Sunday, and ends after Evening Prayer on Pentecost Sunday. These fifty days are a very special time and, as St. Athanasius wrote, they "are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better as one great Sunday." The joyful sound of "Alleluia!" is heard many times throughout this season and we add two "Alleluias" at the dismissal of the Mass today.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. According to the diary of St. Faustina, Jesus said: "...tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon the souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet...." (Diary 699).
