The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is traditionally observed from 18th–25th January. Resources are now available for the 2024 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, prepared by an ecumenical team from Burkina Faso. They have chosen the parable of the Good Samaritan as the theme for this Week.

Holocaust Memorial Day is held on 27th January each year which marks the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. It's a time for everyone to pause to remember the millions of people who have been murdered or whose lives were changed beyond recognition during the Holocaust, and in subsequent genocides. The theme this year is **Fragility of Freedom**.
