Prayer at the end of Mass:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. Mass on Monday mornings at 7.00 am at Our Lady's, followed by breakfast. This could be a good Lenten practice to start each working week with Mass.

The statues in the church. Before the liturgical reforms of the 1960s, the 5th Sunday of Lent was known as Passion Sunday because one of the Gospel accounts of the Passion of Our Lord would be read. To mark that, the statues in the church will be veiled from today until Holy Saturday. The signs of the saints in glory are removed from our sight so that we can concentrate on entering with Jesus into His Passion and death.

Palm Sunday. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, which marks the start of Holy Week – the most important week in the Church's year. We shall begin at the entrance to the church with the blessing of palms, and we shall then process to the altar.

Easter Triduum. There is a list on the table at the back of church inviting people to sign up for various roles at the services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday – welcoming, having feet washed, watching at the altar of repose. There is plenty for everyone so please don't be shy.

The Chrism Mass will take place on Wednesday, 27th March, 11.30 am in St. Chad's Cathedral in Birmingham.

The Solemnity of the Annunciation. Because 25th March this year falls in Holy Week, the Annunciation will be deferred and will be celebrated after Easter.
